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## A Career's Worth of Archives

### Bill LeFurgy: Digital Preservation Pioneer

Bill LeFurgy, Project Manager for Digital Initiatives at the Library of Congress, is about to let go of an enormous amount of responsibility: he is retiring from the Library after 37 years of public service as an archivist, librarian and manager.
